Where is McGregor Pond?

The **Cruise Milford Take a Kid Fishing** competition is located at McGregor Pond, which is an 8.5 km drive from the Te Anau town centre.

Drive out of Te Anau on the Te Anau Mossburn Highway. Turn right immediately after the Whitestone Bridge at McGregor Concrete (Rapid Number 748), travel 1.8km along the gravel road beside the river following the signs. There is a large car parking area available where you will also see the Ray White and Fish & Game tents (you will need to keep driving PAST the pond before you see these).

There is also parking available on the other side of the pond. You will see the signs for this car park as you drive towards the pond.

What will be available at McGregor Pond?

There will be a Sausage Sizzle operating.

Cold drinks will also be available to purchase.

Please note there will be NO Eftpos facilities at the Pond.

How much is it to enter? \$25.00 as an "on the day entry - Friday and Saturday
